

Moss Bluff Part B contains 124 pages of Bible records and first hand interviews with Marion County citizens as well as winter visitors to the Moss Bluff area. These genealogies were compiled by Mr. Frank B. Kingsbury during his winter visits to Moss Bluff from 1938 to 1942.

Before exploring the extensive Genealogical Register, please read page 68 titled Abbreviations. Mr. Kingsbury uses these abbreviations throughout the manuscript. The abbreviation "qv - - - which see" means quod vide. This is used to indicate that more information can be found about the topic somewhere else in the manuscript. Please note the page numbers referred to are the original page numbers in the upper right hand corner of each page and not the page numbers assigned by the PDF viewer.

When reading the genealogies you may encounter a statement like this. "He conducted a store at # 122 and later at # 118". To understand the "# 122" and "# 118" in this section please refer to the explanation given in Part A, page 51. Some of these genealogies date back to the 1600's.

When searching for a name, remember to use name variants and also given names, if a surname does not produce results.
